




Federal Funds, Local Impact:

Apply for an Library Services Technology Act (LSTA) grant from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners (MBLC)



Using federal funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services, MBLC staff and the State Advisory Council on Libraries (SACL) work together to develop grant offerings for local libraries. They review grant applications, make recommendations to the Commission and grants are awarded in July. Here are the basics of how the process works.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

All types of libraries in Massachusetts may apply for LSTA direct grants if they meet the following eligibility criteria:

- A current strategic plan and an action plan covering the grant round year in which you are applying on file at the MBLC.
- A member of Massachusetts Library System (MLS)
- For public libraries, certification in the State Aid to Public Libraries Program

The Commission approves FY2021 Direct Grant program and budget and the FY2021 LSTA Grant Round is announced

December 5, 2019

Letters of Intent due to MBLC

January 2020

Grant writing workshops held across the state

February 20, 2020

Draft grant proposals due

March 2020

MBLC program consultants review proposals and provide comments and recommendations

April 7, 2020

Final LSTA Grant Proposals due

May 2020

SACL and MBLC staff meet to conduct final review and determine funding recommendations to the Board of Commissioners

July 2020

Board of Commissioners reviews and acts on SACL recommendations and budget; Applicants are notified of grant awards
